



Bill Beese is the Forest Ecologist for Western Forest Products in Campbell River, British Columbia. He is a registered Professional Forester with a Bachelors of Science in Forest Management from Southern Illinois and a Masters of Forestry in Forest Ecology from the University of British Columbia. His career includes 28 years on the B.C. coast in research, environmental consulting and policy development for several forest companies. His research has focused on silvicultural systems, prescribed burning, forest regeneration and biodiversity, and includes coordination of multi-disciplinary research. His leadership helped accomplish phase-in of variable retention harvesting as part of the “Coast Forest Strategy”—a team effort that received the Ecological Society of America’s Corporate Award for 2001. He has served on numerous research advisory and review committees, and working groups on old growth forests and ecosystem-based management. He was recently a member of an international science panel advising Forestry Tasmania on implementation of variable retention in old-growth eucalyptus forests.
