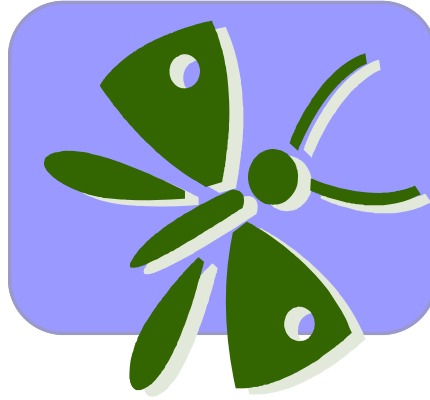


# EXPLORE THE NATURAL HISTORY OF THE SANTA FE RIVER
